Everyone that donates a coat will receive 15% off their bill. Please support this partner, while also supporting CAC and Winter Glow.

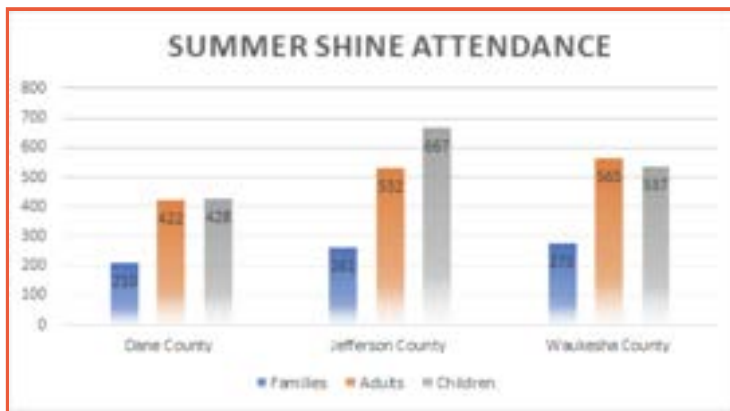

## Summer Shine Recap

This past Summer CAC was able to host nine Summer Shine events, three each in Dane, Jefferson and Waukesha County. Our goal with this program was to distribute Household Cleaning Supplies, Personal Care Products, Diapers, Feminine Hygiene Supplies, Food Boxes for Seniors, and School Supplies and Backpacks in Jefferson and Waukesha Counties.

Through these nine events, we were able to support **718 households**, which contained **over 3,000 adults and children**. We distributed **over 1,200 backpacks** with school supplies to the school-aged children who attended our Summer Shine events.

Thank you to everyone who hosted Summer Shine, allowing CAC to provide these needed items to these families and their children.



## Stockboxes

Community Action Coalition (CAC) is working to make sure everyone, especially seniors, has enough food. After a lifetime of hard work, many seniors find themselves dealing with health issues and on a fixed income. COVID-19 and increasing grocery prices have led to a higher demand for help from food banks.

To address the growing need for food assistance among senior citizens, CAC has relaunched the **Stockbox** program.

This program provides low-income seniors 60 years of age or older whose total income does not exceed the listed guidelines with approximately 40

lives. This ensures that seniors have the food they need for good health and well-being. It frees up their already limited resources for other critical expenses.

A Dane County resident shares his experience with our program: “My dad’s social security does not cover his rent. He receives food stamps, but they don’t go very far anymore. The Stockbox program has been a blessing to my dad and his neighbors.”

Registration for this program is easy. A form must be completed by each individual senior that wants to receive a box. The senior must go to one of our partner agencies that distribute the boxes and sign-up at that location. They must bring with them their proof of age and proof of income to show that they are at least 60 years of age and that they fall within the requisite income guidelines for eligibility. Once registered, participants will have the opportunity to name a proxy or proxies to pick up their food boxes when they are not able to do so.

## MIREPOIX (SOUP BASE)

*Servings: N/A | Prep Time: 20 min | Total Time: 30 min*

### Ingredients:

- 4 carrots, peeled
- 4 stalks celery
- 1 whole onion
- 4-6 cloves garlic (optional)
- 4-5 tbsp. olive oil

### Directions:

- Peel and cut off carrot ends.
- Cut carrots in half lengthwise, then in half again.
- Dice the thin strips of carrot.
- Repeat process with celery stalks.
- Dice the onion (and garlic, if applicable).
- Add all vegetables to a bowl and mix.
- Heat large frying pan to medium heat.
- Once hot, add olive oil and butter.
- Stir in vegetable mix and lower temperature to medium low.
- Cook, stirring frequently, for 15-20 minutes, or until onions start to become translucent to "sweat" the flavors.
- Use as a base for any number of soups/stews.

## CHICKEN SOUP (NOODLES OPTIONAL)

Servings: 8-10 | Prep Time: 45 min | Total Time: 1 hr, 45 min

### Ingredients:

- 4 carrots, peeled
- 4 stalks celery
- 1 whole onion
- 4-6 cloves garlic (optional)
- 4-5 tbsp. olive oil
- 1 whole rotisserie chicken
- 1 bay leaf (optional)
- Seasonings: salt, pepper, dill, thyme, oregano, sage
- 2 32oz. containers of broth

### Directions:

- Start by making the mirepoix (soup case) in a large pot.
- While that cooks, pull meat and skin off chicken and put into a large bowl for later use.
- When mirepoix is ready, stir in pulled chicken.
- Add chicken broth; turn heat to medium high and stir.
- Cover until boiling; once boiling, turn heat down to a simmer, medium low.
- Cover and let simmer for at least an hour, stirring occasionally.
- For chicken noodle soup, par-boil a whole bag of egg noodles (about 6 min.) and add in for the last 10 min. of cooking and stir.
- Scoop into bowls and enjoy.
