Letter from the Executive Director

Moving from short-term gains to long-term transformation.

Community Action Coalition for South Central Wisconsin (CAC) is unique in so many ways. Unlike many non-profit or social service agencies, we work to evolve our menu of programs and services every three years to focus on barriers that prevent low-income people from achieving their goals and obtaining self-sufficiency. For CAC, this often means getting out of the way of other agencies who are doing the work better, while exploring alternative ways to collaborate instead of competing.

For years, the broad discussion on poverty has focused on what individual people can achieve. Helping families obtain living-wage jobs and find affordable places to rent has been the ultimate goal. However, as we evolve our work and examine the current data, we see the cycle of poverty trap generations of hardworking, incredible people who, despite their best efforts, could not make ends meet. The experience of poverty fosters despair and creates nearly insurmountable barriers for almost a third of Wisconsinites.

At CAC, our mission is to transform systems so that all people can achieve social and economic security. This year, we have been walking out our mission in ways that better connect the dots. For our staff, connecting the dots has included new professional development opportunities to improve the quality of services we provide for clients, along with a new \$20-per-hour minimum wage. When it comes to our clients, this measure has meant offering dignity and respect to more than 88,000 low-income families by collaborating with both the public and private sectors to improve access to food security, housing assistance, and essential resources.

In 2022, we distributed more than 14 million pounds of zero-cost food to nearly 100 food pantries and feeding programs; helped keep 300 families in their homes by processing \$2.9 million dollars of mortgage assistance payments; and processed 14,000 applications and provided \$29 million in rental assistance payments to renters to prevent evictions.

Our work is not just about getting results for the short term; it is about re-building our community systems to serve all people better. What makes CAC unique is our keen ability to step in when others step out. We focus on filling gaps and addressing systems because helping people live better lives involves more than programs and services. CAC continues to evolve and advocate for changes to systems and institutions, for the betterment of all.

As Executive Director, I am so proud of the work we are doing to not just change lives, but change the conditions in which low-income families, and all of us, live.




